He proudly states that Gladney, "in a way, is responsible for my life," highlighting how the organization that found him a forever home is now a place where he does this for others.

Greenhill's involvement and impact go beyond the adoption center; he is also a key advocate for cultural growth in Fort Worth. By founding the Fort Worth Film Commission, Greenhill is a critical driver behind the growing local creative community. He promotes Fort Worth as a vibrant location for dynamic storytelling. His belief that "it's all about the story" serves as a guiding light in his professional and community work.

He also sits on the board of the Mind, Body, Ecology Institute, which is committed to helping young adults who suffer from anxiety and depression heal through exposure to nature. According to the organization's website, their mission is "creating a regenerative, equitable, and ecologically harmonious world."

The Path to Purpose

Duke Greenhill's career started off on an impressive note, setting the tone for his diverse experiences. After graduating from Arlington Heights High School, Greenhill went on to attend the University of Texas at Austin, where he earned a Bachelor of Arts in Communication in 2002. Shortly after, in 2006, Greenhill made the move to New York City, where he attended the prestigious Columbia University and received his MFA in Film Production and Screenwriting.

After living in New York for nearly two decades, Greenhill made the significant shift from the fast-paced world of advertising to enter the realm of academia. In 2018, he took a position at the esteemed Savannah College of Art and Design. At SCAD, Greenhill led strategic initiatives that launched departments to top national rankings, including creating the School of Business Innovation. He also enhanced SCAD's reputation by writing articles and developed the university's first fully online degree program, significantly increasing enrollment and revolutionizing online learning strategies. He accomplished all of this while teaching up to ten courses annually.

Greenhill made the decision to move back to his roots in Fort Worth, Texas, with the birth of his nephews. He began teaching at Texas Christian University's Department of Strategic Communications in 2022, leading classes such as advertising, campaigns and creative strategy. While working in academia, Greenhill took opportunities to get involved with his home-town community. He serves on the board of the Gladney Center for Adoption and is active with the Mind Body Ecology Institute, a group that uses nature to support young people dealing with anxiety and depression. He believes that "nature has the power to ground us." His influential work in many fields, including community service, film, and advertising, demonstrates a dedication to sharing moving stories that make leaving a lasting mark on many.
